The Five-Volume Set

The first fifty-one of Meher Baba's discourses were published serially (one per issue) in the *Meher Baba Journal*, a monthly magazine that issued from its editorial offices in Bangalore and Ahmednagar between November 1938 and October 1942. Concurrently, Adi K. Irani and the Publication Committee (as it was called) began to release annual volumes, each of which collected the discourses that had been featured in the *Journal* during the previous one-year period (November through October).

The first four volumes of the five-volume set, then, consist of Meher Baba's discourses in the first four volumes of the *Meher Baba Journal*, which they reproduce unedited in the order of their original publication. The fifth volume of the five-volume set, however, contains eighteen more discourses that had not yet appeared in print when the *Journal* discontinued publication in late 1942.

Collectively, then, the first editions of the five volumes were issued between 1939 and 1943. Between 1939 and 1955 various volumes individually went through various further editions. Conventionally it is said that the five-volume set had five editions. In reality, each volume had its own separate publication history, with the number of known editions ranging from two to five. Though detailed research on this topic has not yet been carried out, it seems that the editing between editions was minimal; in effect, subsequent "editions" were largely reprints of the first editions.

The publication history of the five-volume set is an immensely complicated topic that has been reviewed in greater detail in the fourth volume of the revised sixth edition of Meher Baba's *Discourses*, published by Sheriar Foundation in 2007. Consequently, the page numbers in the editions listed above will not always coincide with paginations for other editions.
