After discussion with B re: going to U.S.A. enquiries were made at the Cooke Wagon Lits re: boats, & a copy of sailing list was obtained.

In the afternoon again we went to Cooke, for definite information re: tonnage & fares etc for boats fr. Italy & France which B. preferred. (He avoided England, consistently while going to USA). Boats from Italy - Naples - sailing on 17th - 25th & 28th were selected for the time being, and further definite decision was postponed till our going to Milano.

While going to purchase tickets for Milano by the Orient Express for tomorrow, we were fazed to understand that as some Turkish Minister was going tomorrow, there was heavy booking by tomorrow's train & no 2nd class berths were available & so we had to book berths for day after tomorrow, i.e. Wednesday. Thus we had to stay one day more here - where none of us liked to stay any longer.

Rust. too booked his passage by a Turkish boat leaving tomorrow for Alexandria.

Whole day today was spent in much work re: preparations for leaving, booking passage etc. & discussing future plans.

B's private talk with me again re: 'Bad mood' whether I liked to go with him to ~~USA~~ or leave etc. What to reply? The question of 'mood' was talked over yesterday. B. clearly said that he had some object in doing like this with Me, & when I said I am unable to suffer this & keep in good mood too, he said he wouldn't hereafter do it. & wouldn't exercise his right of his treatment with me, packing etc. if I didn't work it. There was no question of whiskey at all. It was a question of 'helplessness', & hence had I to raise my hands. But B. said he would see & spare me as much as he could. I had to keep quiet & submit.

To erase the effects of the day's drudgery & for a part-time hob, we went to ~~20/26~~ after meals, but were utterly disappointed & actually cheated.

Packing & other preparations etc for getting down at Milan at 5 pm.

Payment of Tax & Tips etc. - - -

Arrived 5.30 - Enard not found on station -
walk out & after getting our baggage fr. the guard (being)
take taxis or run down to Enard's quarters - the only
best thing to do under the circumstances. While Ined
was away to take delivery of the bedclothes fr. the broker,
& we were standing out under the Arch (ground -)
lots of people assembled around us, including agents fr. hotel
& all peculiarly looked at us & our odd peculiar appearance.
We 3 were in one taxi, & Ined alone in another, so we were
as if at the Mercy of the taxi driver, knowing nothing of

Arrive, after several enquiries, near the hotel
Imperial & while Ined was away enquiring, Enard
suddenly appeared & expressed at once her profound

(25 minutes earlier).

After meals at the hotel, as this was a Saturday, (offices closed in the afternoon) we drove in a big buss, from the public stand (opp. the Grand Cathedral) to the Certosa Monastery — an hour's drive from Milan.

As in all other places of religious importance, the nuisance of guide here too was awkwardly felt. A 1/2 legged old man, whose very appearance gave an impression of his crooked nature, offered himself to go with us as a Guide, as he happened to speak English (for us). Kingdom, received reports & manages every Second
from almost all parts of the Universe — How as
times are troublesome, reports of these troubles, like war

etc. - say between Japan & China - always poured in, & he had to attend to them & issue instructions etc. tho' quite untroubled to anyone externally, as these things he managed all internally. However, its effects externally did appear, as for instance, in the change of his mood suddenly, quite abruptly - one moment he may be in jolly good mood, next moment quite moody, morose etc, contemplating on his plans & working etc according to reports received.
