The Unpleasant accusation

The first thought after tea or breakfast was that of taking immediate steps to remedy the last night's incident re: the false accusation on A. of "entering the Jew's Cabin" —

On B's instruction, a word was sent to the Chief Purser with a copy of the "Every man" containing article on Baba, and a Note (by Stan) to inform him of the last night's false accusation, how it had ^{caused} us annoyance, & requesting investigation, etc. ... At the same time the Chief Steward, when he came for orders for meals for the day, was also informed of this unpleasant incident quite politely yet seriously, assuring him of B's stay with B. for the last 5 years, of his honesty pure character, & that he has constant company with B. now & us even on board etc., & that there was some grave misunderstanding, or a grave intrigue by somebody, & requesting investigation which the good officer promised, in spite of his taking

this matter quite lightly, & lay heavy it out

And true to their word, both - the Chief Purser & Steward - juggled into the matter, as it was subsequently found that the Jew, who so excitedly accused A last night & made a scene by telling of this to all the passengers in the hall, talked now quite gently to Mr. Star, when called, and on being explained of the situation, quite frankly apologised, and requested Mr. Star to ask the dark lady who had informed him of A's getting into his cabin, 2-3 times - This was the result of the investigation by the Ch. However, she got hold of Star at Night, & in a most genteel manner expressed her regret that she had been the cause of all this, having informed the Jew - that it was quite probably the Jew's son she had seen entering her Cabin, & she mistook A. for him etc.

It appeared she & the Jew had an explanation in this matter, clearing all doubts in the mind of the Jew - who was also given the Article about B. in 'Everyman' to read. Poor Jew - he was made a fool of by these enterprising party. However, B. said, he will know him, who he was, in future.

It may be said to the Credit of Mrs L. that in spite of the last night's incident of A. being ^{accused} ^{of laughing} so severely, she quite frankly & freely talked with him openly before all, on deck & in the hall, to prove to all that A. was in a respectable party, quite innocent of these lame accusations etc.
