Port Said & At Sea - 3<sup>rd</sup>

Left Port Said, early Morning, about 9 A.M. Vented Mediterranean.

Said the first copy of the P. & A. booklet, published in India, & received yesterday.... Beautiful get-up, printing..... Discussion re: Rauiji's booklet published in Nasik, can't compare at all with this at all..... decided to get it revised, and reprinted in England, by the same Circle Publishing Committee, and the case of books to be kept in Italy in Steamship Co's office, to accompany us by the "Cafe Rossi" sailing round 102 Mts.

The Surprise! At about 10 A.M. Mr Parmeshwar, Secretary to Sir Hyderi, knocked at his cabin, and explained that Sir Hyderi wished to come over to B. and thank him & much for his kind thoughts that helped him to persuade his son Not to land at Port Said, and to which the boy readily agreed. Looking to the boy's obstinacy and fondness (now) for "Sharabi" they were afraid he'd want to return, and would create trouble & cause disorder, but to our surprise, he readily consented. When Sir Hyderi believed to be sure of the result of B's thoughts, and went to express their heartfelt thanks - Sir Hyderi - I worked to see B. personally.

He was allowed to visit... He thanked B. & much personally, as also behalf of Lady Hyderi. He said it was really surprising, & unexpected. The boy didn't at all argue, but ready accepted my order & wish when I said that I didn't expect him to land - at this late hour.

He was shown the new book let just received yesterday, to London. Re return passage to India, he said, he will try to get it, if available, by the "Cafe Rossi" to be in the same ship with B., or worked B. to his residence at Hyderabad, once more. He happened to visit that place.... He left off thanking B. repeatedly, for all he had done for his son, & solicited his "Nazar" on him - all.

At 8 in the Morning, we arrived Ullwin - changed train for Arla, passport & luggage inspection had to be gone through. None of 'Pickfords' men appeared on either platform, and it was with difficulty we could manage to get on to the Arla Express, which had only one second class compartment - all others being First & Pullmanns. There was a row about seats which the Conductors said were reserved previously, and we couldn't possibly all get seats in the Second. Cooks man was consulted, but he seemed to feel annoyed for our having booked through Pickfords, and wouldn't advise spontaneously. However, he did say something, & helped us somehow, advising us to get at least four II to be transferred to the I - and others with. Tod & Ade were stopped on the way in the I cl. compartment, by the Conductor, when they were returning to the II after the train had left Ullwin station. No explanation seemed to satisfy the man, who got hold of both - nor would he listen, much less understand, and it was only after a clever ruse, they evaded him and escaped, at the next halt.

Hardly had we seated made ourselves comfortable in the 4 vacant seats in a compartment, with four 2nd class passengers. The Conductor came for ticket examination : At first, he did not say anything, but so soon did he recognise the two - Tod & Ade - he played a game, and compelled us to get up and vacate our seats which he said were reserved, and put in other four passengers, who had arrived later, after us, and were standing in the corridor. After such a confusion, when we hardly had our seats, we were forced out, and made to stand, and goodness knows how long - as we couldn't even stand with ease, the carriage giving sharp jerks, so shaking us from the very being .....
