IN AUGUST THIS YEAR, the Trust hosted the 19th annual Meherabad Young Adult Sahavas Program, which had 160 participants from six countries-India, USA, China, Dubai, Singapore, and Malaysia, with the majority from India. The program opened with a warm welcome to all and orientation, the offering of a large flower garland to Baba at the Samadhi, and an evening dhuni program. The theme this year was "Inviting His Grace." Throughout the week the sahavasees participated in a wide variety of activities focused on Baba. Discussion groups, service projects, arts and cultural workshops, and performances kept everyone busy and happy!

Participants also visited Meherazad, as well as had historical tours around Meherabad so they could learn the sacred significance of the places Baba graced with His presence. They walked up Meherazad's Seclusion Hilll, and visited the East Room on Meherabad Hill, Mandali Hall, and other sites. The Celebration Evening was given to dance, drama, and devotional singing presentations by the sahavasees, which they had prepared during the week's workshops. Service projects included planting drought-hardy trees on a large tract of Trust property, mural painting in Baba's n colors on the walls of the railway un pass, trash cleaning, painting Gilori Shah's tomb, and more.

We are enthused to announce that our new solar electricity project on the Archives building, Manzil-e-Meher, is now operational. The solar power started flowing into the grid the last week of February 2019, and additional solar panels were installed in mid-October. The total cost of this project is about Rs.7,72,000. The project was overseen by an Australian Baba lover, Paul Morris. We are also thankful to others who donated some of the inverters used in the system. Next we plan to move

Happily, we have had plentiful rains this monsoon season, nearly 30 inches (76 cm). The surrounds are still green even in November, and our groundwater levels have risen. Our new water storage reservoir has been filled to capacity, 30 million litres.

Our work on the Tower of Glory is in the finishing stages. At the time of writing, we are intending the inauguration of the tower to take place on 23 December 2019, the anniversary of Baba's own

dedication of the site in 1944. After many years of love-studded hard work, this project will fulfill Baba's wish and also serve to glorify Him. We look forward to sharing this event with our Baba family.

Solar Electricity Arrives at Meherabad

Meher Baba graces Meherabad with over 300 clear, sunny days a year. He also graces Meherabad with volunteers with expertise in solar power. The result? Solar electrical power for Meherabad! We have already been using passive solar panels for heating water in the Meher Pilgrim Retreat since that building opened in 2006, but the generation of electricity is a new, much-anticipated venture for Meherabad.

A 9.3-kW system with 27 solar panels was installed on the Manzil-e-Meher Archives Building this year. The panels will generate enough power to provide for more than 100% of the building's needs.

The twenty seven 345-Watt panels with individual Enphase micro-inverters underneath will generate an estimated yearly total of 20,000 kWh (kilowatt hours). Nineteen panels were installed in February and an additional 8 were installed in mid-October.

This high-tech system has data collection, and early results have already seen up to 9 kWh exported

into the Meherabad network on one day. At the time of this data collection, cloudy conditions prevailed, but greater results are expected as the weather cools and the sky clears.

Expansion to the MPR

The Trust is currently working to install a 30-kW system on the men's side terrace at the MPR, which will hopefully produce electricity by mid-February 2020.

Data collection has indicated up to 400 units' consumption on busy days. Early estimates suggest we could halve the yearly expense the Trust incurs with the government electrical supply for the MPR as a result of the new solar system.

We propose to use approx. 90 Vikram or Waaree solar panels and Enphase IQ+ inverters for this project. If any Baba lovers have any connection with the manufacturers/suppliers of this equipment and can get the same at a discounted price, it will be most welcome.

Master Planning Engagement


THE TRUST INITIATED a master planning effort four years ago in anticipation of the time when many more pilgrims will want to avail themselves of the opportunity for Baba's darshan at the Trust estate. This plan includes the development of Meherabad, Meherazad, and Meher Nazar up to the point when a million pilgrims come for darshan. This is in keeping with Baba's own statements about how widespread His name will have become as He manifests publicly.

To create the plan, a committee composed of trustees and senior residents gathered input from a wide range of Trust committees, and then formulated a plan that was approved in draft form by the trustees in 2018. This year a major effort has been conducted to include the Baba community throughout the world in reviewing the draft plan and providing feedback. By the end of December, sessions will have been held in twelve locations—six in the West and six in India. The size of these sessions has ranged from 30 to 300 participants at a time. In each session, the plan was presented, and then participants gathered in small groups to generate feedback, which was then shared with the entire meeting.


Participants have consistently expressed appreciation for the plan, as well as the opportunity to learn about these future plans and to provide feedback. The sessions have also produced numerous constructive suggestions, which the planning committee will consider when it reconvenes in 2020 to finalize the plan. Once the trustees adopt the final plan, the worldwide Baba family will be kept informed of the progress toward its fulfillment.

For those who were not able to participate in these meetings, a summary of the draft plan is available on the Trust website along with a form to provide feedback. All are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity, which will remain available until 31 December 2019.

This master planning engagement effort is the first time the Trust has involved the worldwide Baba family so extensively in future planning. The goal of this engagement is to develop a sense of responsibility in all His lovers for the future of these sacred sites that Baba has made available to humanity in perpetuity.



The Great Darshan 50-Year Anniversary

A commemoration of Baba's Great Darshan of 1969 was held at Meherabad in November this year. A woven mixture of song, dance, sharings by Darshan attendees, and films of Baba, the program was attended by about 600 Baba lovers from around the world. Presentations were held at the Amphitheatre on Meherabad Hill opposite Baba's Samadhi.

Avatar Meher Baba had invited His lovers from east and west to attend a large Darshan program, to be held from April to June 1969. Plans were underway during the latter weeks of 1968. But on 31 January 1969, Baba dropped His physical body, sending shockwaves around the world in the hearts of His lovers. The mandali soon realized that they had many signs from Baba that the darshan program was to go on and they let the Baba world know that the 1969 Darshan would be held, as planned by Baba.

In an account of Baba's last days, Francis Brabazon wrote on behalf of the resident mandali: "On 13th October 1968 Baba told us that He would give His darshan to all His lovers all over the world from 10th April to 10th June 1969. Considering His physical condition we were apprehensive of His body standing such a strain. But He said, 'It will be easy for me to give my lovers my darshan, so you are not to feel concerned about it. I will give darshan reclining and that will be no strain on my body. It will be different from all previous darshans and it will be the last in silence. Although I will be reclining I will be very strong. My physical condition now is because of my work, but by then my work will be complete and my exultation will be great.""*

Fifty years later, many who attended that wonderful "darshan of darshans" came from near and far to share their recollections of the experiences they had when they came to honor the God-Man's invitation. The wonder of the Master's darshan being given and received despite His physical absence was expressed beautifuly by Francis Brabazon in addressing the group at the darshan.

"Who but the Beloved of Beloveds, could speak his Word silently in your hearts and make you come from across the world to take his darshan, to bow down to him in your hearts? Such a thing has never happened before. I have been at Mass-darshans where tens of thousands came and bowed down to his Man-form. But to come thousands of miles to bow down to him in one's own heart, that is of an entirely different order of devotion.

"Why has beloved Baba given you people this extraordinary privilege? Because he required a few to do what the many, what everyone, must eventually do: journey across the world of illusion to take darshan of him in their hearts. What a Beloved is our Beloved; what a mighty Beloved."



Upcoming Inauguration of the Tower of Glory

On 23 December 1944, Meher Baba held a dedication and foundation-laying ceremony at Meherabad for the future Memorial Tower, to be created to honor Baba's departed devotees. Baba chose the site of the memorial graves of His disciples Masaji and F.H. Dadachanji. He explained in His statement, which was read out, that these two disciples and the many others whose names would be inscribed on the tower were being honored as an inspiration for lovers of God in the future.

We reported in our last issue that the carving of the names on the memorial tower was nearly complete. Following the carving, the letters were all painted with a special stone colorant flown in by hazmat vault on a cargo plane. The colorant is a grey color, more similar to a stain than to paint. Other works in recent months were the completion of the 7 symbols representing the religions of the world, as well as Baba's "Mastery in Servitude" emblem, the placement of a slate apron around the base, and the raising of the two original grave markers of Chanji and Masaji. The markers were reassembled exactly in their original positions

Water Reservoir

Thanks to plentiful rains and a long monsoon season this year, we were able to fill the "Shet Talav," the Trust's new water reservoir, to capacity. The tank is 60 metres deep and holds 30 million litres of water. To give you an idea of how much water that is, it is estimated that in an emergency, with no other water sources, and with water usage restrictions in place, the full reservoir could supply the water needs of Meherabad for two full years.

Somehow Mastan still could not believe that Baba was gone and so again Mehera witnessed his almost human devotion to the God-Man. "[Mastan] did something he had never done before—[he] walked into Baba's room alone. . . Very slowly Mastan walked around Baba's bed, just as he had walked around the dining room table and Baba's chair."*

It seemed with that final act of confirmation Mastan knew that Baba was no more and from that day he stopped eating. On 18th April, while Mehera and the mandali were in Guruprasad for the Great Darshan program, Baba's Mastan passed away.

Today, fifty years later, dogs continue to be a part of Meherazad life, not only as loving pets but also to act as guards over His home. Through the years, Meherazad residents have marveled at the unusual connections some of these animals have had with the Avatar and His mandali. With Meherazad's present trio of dogs aging, it was recently felt it was time to add some new blood to the crew. This April, two adorable puppies from the same litter, a labrador and mongrel mix,

named Layla and Sachin, have joined the Meherazad household. The brother and sister have already endeared themselves to Meherazad residents as the newest pets, and they will also be trained to protect Baba's home, following in the footsteps of Bhooty and Mastan, and all those dogs fortunate to have
