BABA GAVE THESE TIMELESS, comforting words in the Memorial Tower foundation dedication speech in 1944. A


number of Baba's lovers have passed on recently, some due

Master. One such soul named on the Tower was Baba's brother, Jamshed. The sudden death in 1926 of this young man shocked and deeply grieved Baba's mandali, but Baba was unfazed and gave one of the most straightforward, ever-relevant discourses on death. Jamshed's short bio from the bio-glossary is followed by excerpts of Baba's words from 1926:

"He was Baba's elder brother who was also one of his earliest disciple companions. He died just after celebrating Baba's grand birthday in Meherabad, 1926, prompting Baba to give one of the great discourses on death and the soul."

FROM PRINCIPAL DEED OF AVATAR MEHER BABA TRUST


As many are aware, India experienced soaring rates of COVID-19 infection, but many restrictions have just been lifted. There are currently fewer COVID-19 cases in Maharashtra and in the city of Ahmednagar, where hospital beds were in short supply. Several Trust workers and other resident Baba lovers caught the virus, and a few have passed on to Baba.

Hostel C is still in use by the local government, although with less demand. Only a few COVID-19-positive patients are currently being accommodated there. There are 25 such places around Ahmednagar District, which are needed by persons living with family members in a small home where effective isolation cannot be carried out. The COVID-19-positive patients are discharged when their COVID-19 test results are negative. The government will continue this usage of Hostel C for the time being.

Meherabad Medical Services continues to provide quality care for residents and Trust workers while maintaining safety precautions. Meher Health Center (MHC) staff utilizes full protective gear. We are pleased to have Dr. Chandramala, a volunteer from Hyderabad, join MHC. Hours have been reduced and staff continues to receive their full salaries, even during lockdowns. The Homeopathic Dispensary has mostly been able to operate regularly.

All workers have been tested for COVID-19, with ongoing testing available at regular intervals. The Isolation Ward at lower Meherabad behind the Meherabad hospital is used to quarantine those residents potentially exposed to the virus. The trustees are working diligently to acquire vaccines for workers and many have already been at least partially vaccinated.

Recently the Trust was told that Meherabad is #1 in Ahmednagar District for the number of patients discharged healthy from COVID-19 facilities. Clearly, the loving atmosphere of Beloved Baba is helping these patients recover quickly. Meherabad volunteers and workers are all doing their best to dance to Baba's new tune, giving the care that would please Him, relying on Him to provide solutions



MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Baba Family,

Beloved Baba has said that the waves do not roll and the leaves do not move without His will, so we know that these current unprecedented times are all according to His will. As His lovers we simply have to do our best to remember Him and to remember it is not we who are doing anything, but He who is getting everything done. Despite these challenging times the Trust has stayed very active planning for the masses that Baba has said will be coming for His darshan. (Please see "Trust Adopts Master Plan.") Maintenance projects continue, including care for Beloved Baba's Samadhi. During these times, Trust employees continue to work and to receive their pay. The global pandemic has impacted everyone and Baba's Trust has been no exception. These continue to be trying times for the Trust financially. (Please see the enclosed annual Financial Report.)

As we are a Charitable Trust the government continues to use its right to appropriate our facilities during

times of crisis by using Hostel C for COVID-19 relief. The Hostel C COVID-19 Centre is specifically for those people who are COVID-19–positive but do not need to be hospitalized. They must be quarantined to protect their families and villages from catching this

virus. Beloved Baba's living example of "Mastery in Servitude" to others is reflected in the Trust Deed stating that providing "succour" during disasters is one of the objectives of the Trust.

As of June 7th, the Maharashtra government lifted some restrictions, but no one knows whether there will be more COVID-19 surges, so the authorities do not want to dismantle the arrangements just yet. We know for certain that things are still uncertain. For the time being there are no plans for when Arti may resume at

the Samadhi. We are sorry to announce that there will be no Meherabad Silence Day observance this July and it is uncertain when there will be opening up of accommodations for pilgrims at Meherabad.

We know people are longing to come back to Meherabad. Visits to Meherabad may be restricted, but visits to Baba are always available when we do not absent ourselves from Him.

"Don't lose heart, but keep me in your heart and know I am always with you."


One day humanity's throngs will once again bow down at Beloved Baba's door. Let's take solace in His own words:

In a meeting held on 20th March 2021, the Board of Trustees of the Avatar Meher Baba P.P.C.Trust selected

After graduation, Meher Prasad completed a diploma in Industrial Relations and Personnel Management as well as a Master's in Business Administration. After his education he started a construction company and also worked as a clearing and forwarding agent with the Godrej Group. Meher Prasad has great interests in water management as well as disaster management, which will be very helpful for ongoing development at Meherabad. He especially enjoys working on detailed preparation and follow-through work for Amartithi. An ardent lover of music, he also takes special interest in maintaining good public relations.

Mr. Raju feels that being chosen as a trustee is "the greatest blessing the Beloved showered on me. I pray to my Master Avatar Meher Baba to give me strength in shouldering this responsibility in a righteous perspective, which will help me to walk toward the Mastery of Servitude."

with an invisible waterproofing solution. This treatment was first recommended by the conservation architect who consulted with the Trust when the murals were repaired in the early 1990s. The solution

reduces moisture coming through the exterior of the walls, which damages the murals inside. The waterproofing was done at that time and periodically in the years since. The recent hot weather has dried the walls sufficiently at long last and the work has begun.

Trust Adopts Master Plan

MEHER BABA HAS SAID THAT MEHERABAD would become the greatest place of world pilgrimage. To prepare for that eventuality, in February this year the Trust approved the Master Plan for the development of Trust properties at Meherabad, Meherazad, and Meher Nazar. This plan is in keeping with

Meher Baba's directives as expressed in the Trust Deed of the Avatar Meher Baba Trust that was established by Him in 1959.

The Master Plan calls for expanding the Trust's capacity to handle up to 1 million pilgrims at a time at Meherabad, and also allows for significant expansion at Meherazad and Meher Nazar. The plan preserves the sacred nature of all of these places, especially the area around the Samadhi, historic sites at lower Meherabad, the entirety of Meherazad, and the Meher Nazar compound. The plan also significantly increases the facilities and infrastructure that will be required. And finally, charitable objects will be significantly expanded—especially in the areas of health care and education.

The demand for access to Trust properties has been relatively stable for some years now. However, there is precedent that shows that the situation could change quickly. For example, Sai Baba's Samadhi at Shirdi attracted few pilgrims for decades after his pass-

ing. However, that situation changed very rapidly after the broadcast of a film and TV series about Sai Baba. Today up to 50,000 pilgrims come on a normal day, and on major holidays the numbers are as many as 400,00.

Likewise, interest in Meherabad could also increase suddenly—hence the importance of having a plan in place now to ensure that the development of necessary facilities, buffer land, and infrastructure keeps pace with anticipated increase in demand.

THE STRUCTURE OF THE MASTER PLAN

THE MASTER PLAN IS BUILT around a set of core principles that will help to ensure that the development adheres to the expressed wishes of Meher Baba. In addition, the perspectives of close mandali were carefully considered in formulating the plan. The Meherazad portion of the Trust Master Plan incorporates a prior Meherazad Master Plan that the Meherazad resident mandali had established. And this current Trust Master Plan provides the first-ever plan for the future of Meher Nazar.

Meher Baba offered no timeline for the growth of interest in pilgrimage to Meherabad. Therefore, rather than creating a plan based on specific time-frames, it is designed around three different stages of increase in pilgrim numbers: The first stage is when there are twice as many people coming as today, the next stage is for five times as many people, and the third stage is when twenty-five times as

many people are coming as today, Plan, only time will tell which would be up to 1 million whether this is the

The Trust also cannot know whether 1 million people will be the ultimate maximum number of pilgrims who will need to be accommodated—however, this Master Plan will provide a solid foundation for any further planning that may be required as awareness of Meher Baba as the Avatar of the Age unfolds.

THE MASTER PLAN for developing the Trust is designed to fulfill the following vision:

Avatar Meher Baba has said that His advent will be the end of a cycle of cycles and His manifestation will be the greatest. Therefore, Meherabad and Meherazad will become places of world pilgrimage, where multitudes come to pay homage at His feet and to:

- o Experience Meher Baba's Divine Love;
- o Learn about His life and message of truth and love; and
- Dedicate themselves to a life lived in His remembrance, love, and service

ENGAGEMENT

THE MASTER PLAN was created over a period of six years through a process that initially engaged residents from all segments of Trust operations. An initial draft Master Plan was prepared from all of this input.

The next phase of the process was perhaps unique in the history of the Trust—the direct engagement of the worldwide Baba family. Trustees understand that the whole Baba family cares deeply about these sites and what will happen to them in the future. It is also recognized that ultimately, the whole worldwide Baba family will be involved in supporting the development of these properties.


Therefore, the Trust decided to have engagement meetings around the Baba world to share the draft Master Plan and to get feedback. Held in the United States, Australia, the United Kingdom, and in numerous locations within India, about 1,000 participants

were given an overview of the plan. Feedback was then generated after small group discussions. The plan received overall enthusiastic reception, and the participants provided numerous useful ideas and suggestions. The feedback was carefully reviewed and used by the Trust in finalizing the Master Plan. This engagement process made it clear that the global Baba family greatly valued their involvement and looks forward to continued opportunities to provide input.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

NOW THAT THE PLAN has been finalized, the hard work starts—the plan must be implemented and kept fresh, so every five to seven years, the Trust will review and update the plan. The needs for development for the coming few years will be anticipated, and priorities will be set in keeping with the blueprint provided by the Master Plan. Through this ongoing cycle of review and planning, the Master Plan will be kept current, and will provide a basis for continuing to develop Meherabad, Meherazad, and Meher Nazar in a steady and practical manner.

Of course, what will happen to these sites so intimately associated with the current advent of the Avatar is completely at the will of the Beloved. The Master Plan is a significant part of the Trust's effort to fulfill its responsibility given to the trustees by Meher Baba. However, as a participant in one of the worldwide engagement meetings said, "While this may be the Trust Master

opposite the Dhuni. The rainwater drainage system near the Dhuni underpass was completed. Maintenance of all infrastructure continues.

AFFORESTATION: A large new nursery near one of the wells has been planted, and the Meherabad afforestation trees are being cared for in concerted efforts for environmental preservation.

SOLAR POWER: About a year ago, the Trust installed a solar power generation system at Meher Pilgrim Retreat (MPR). It started generating power in June 2020. Since the lockdown, consumption went down by more than 50%, so the power from this system is enough to provide for current consumption, which means the Trust is not paying any electric bill for the MPR. From June 2020 to March 2021, this system has provided enough power at a cost savings of Rs. 2,91,965. (\$4,000) The total cost of the MPR solar power installation was about Rs.1.7 million (\$23,000). Encouraged by these positive results, the Trust is now planning to install a bigger solar power facility at Lower Meherabad. The estimated cost will be about Rs. 5 million (\$68,000).

MEHER ENGLISH SCHOOL held classes for the students of 5th to 10th standard partially in 2020. Preliminary exams were conducted in 2021 but, per government COVID-19 directives, the school closed again. Online lessons are sent to the students.

TRUST VILLAGE RELATIONS: Funds were provided for Arangaon street lights, water line repair, compound work for AMB Centre, tree guards, and feeding the poor, as well as help toward the expansion of the Seena River in Pimpalgaon Malvi.

How to Contribute

In 1959 Baba established the AVATAR MEHER BABA TRUST. Stated in His Trust Deed are many objects including the upkeep of all the Meherabad and Meherazad facilities supporting pilgrimage to Beloved Baba's Tombshrine and home, as well as services to the public mainly through its medical facilities and the Meher English School. Trust facilities are available to anyone "irrespective of caste, creed, race, religion, nationality or sex." THE TRUST is supported entirely by love-gifts from Meher Baba's lovers around the world. In truth, it is Baba Himself who brings the objects to completion which He Himself laid down in the Trust Deed, when it pleases Him to do so.



Fortunately, residents and most workers at Meherazad were able to get vaccinations. Nevertheless, there have been cases affecting some of our workers, and one of our watchmen, who suffered from other ailments, succumbed to COVID-19. There is a silver lining in this pause caused by the virus: with less people around, the

"If you have love for the dead, it should be selfless. The dead do not want your expressions of sadness. Manifest such love for them that they would be pleased and at peace. If you want the consciousness of their souls to progress, express selfless love. Do not make them unhappy by your weeping and wailings. . . .

"He who is convinced that after death there is birth again never worries or sorrows. What is the use of sorrowing over dried-up crops in the field? By dying before death [annihilating the mind] you will gain both worlds. Otherwise, it is a never-ending cycle of taking birth and dying. There is no escape. It is a matter of luck. What can we do when our last day dawns? It is not in our hands, so what can be done? We all have to go one day. So, what is the sense of weeping? One can do nothing except submit to God's will."

When asked how to even begin to understand what Baba was telling the mandali, Baba replied: "From believing those who know the secrets of life and death."* How fortunate for us that Baba always points the way, strengthening our resolve by stating: "Inscribe these words in your heart: nothing is real but God; nothing matters but love for God."
