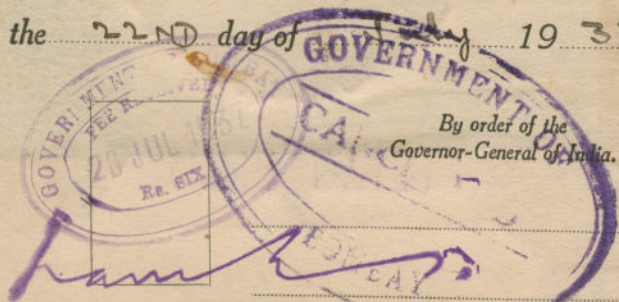
NOTICE TO TRAVELLERS TO EGYPT.

EXTRACT FROM PASSPORT REGULATIONS.

1. Applications for Indian Passports must be made in the prescribed form and submitted either direct or through the local authority—
 (a) in the case of a resident in British India, to the Provincial Government concerned.
 (b) in the case of a resident in an Indian State, to the Political Officer concerned.

2. The charge for an Indian Passport is Rs. 3.

3. Indian Passports are granted to—

- (a) British Subjects by birth.
 (b) Wives and widows of such persons.
 (c) British Subjects by naturalisation.
 (d) British protected persons.

A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the State of which her husband is for the time being a subject.

4. Passports are granted upon the production of a declaration by the applicant (in the case of a child under 15 requiring a separate Passport by the child's parent or guardian) in the prescribed form of application verified by a declaration made by a *Political Officer, Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, Police Officer not below the rank of Superintendent, or Notary Public, resident in India.*

5. If the applicant for a Passport be a British Subject by Naturalisation, the certificate of naturalisation must be forwarded with the form of application to the officer empowered to grant the Passport. It will be returned with the Passport to the applicant through the person who may have verified the declaration.

British subjects by Naturalisation will be described as such, in their Passports, which will be issued subject to the necessary qualifications.

6. Small duplicate unmounted photographs of the applicant (and wife, if to be included) must be forwarded with the application for a Passport, one of which must be certified on the back by the person verifying the declaration made in the application form.

7. Indian Passports are not available beyond five years from date of issue. They may be renewed for a further maximum period of five years after which fresh Passports must be obtained. The fee for renewal is Re. 1 for each year, or portion of a year, for which the Passport is renewed.

8. Passports cannot be issued or renewed on behalf of persons already abroad; such persons should apply for Passports to the London Foreign Office or nearest British Mission or Consulate. Passports must not be sent out of India by post.

9. In the case of an applicant for a Passport being unable to write English, a transcription in English should be placed below the applicant's vernacular signature in the form of application. In the case of an illiterate person, a thumb impression should be substituted for a signature on the form of application, which should be certified by the person verifying the declaration.

10. The Passport is only available for travel to the countries named on page 4, but may be endorsed for additional countries. The possession of a Passport so endorsed does not exempt the holder from compliance with any Immigration laws in force in British or Foreign Countries, or from the necessity of obtaining a visa where required.

11. Passports endorsed as valid for the British Empire are also available for travelling to territory under British protection or mandate, not, however, including Palestine or Iraq, for which countries the Passport must be specially endorsed.

12. British subjects resident abroad should in all cases register their names and addresses at the nearest British Consulate. Such registration constitutes the most ready means in emergency or difficulty of enabling all proper assistance or advice to be afforded them. Changes of address in or departure from the country of residence should also be notified to the Consulate.

Persons merely passing through a foreign country or making a short stay there are not regarded as residents, and need not register unless their stay exceeds three months.
